The consolidated annual financial results include unaudited financial statement / financial information of the two subsidiaries located in India which are incorporated during February and March 2025. These subsidiaries have not prepared financial statements, since their first financial year will end on 31st March 2026, whose financial statements / financial information reflect total assets of Rs.600.33 Lakhs as at 31st March, 2025, total revenues of Rs. Nil, total net loss of Rs. 5.34 Lakhs, total comprehensive income of (-) Rs. 5.34 Lakhs and net cash Inflows amounting to Rs.25.10 Lakhs for the period from incorporation to 31st March 2025 as furnished by the management.

Two of the Nine subsidiaries are located outside India whose financial information have been prepared in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in its respective country. The Parent Company's Management has converted this financial information from accounting principles generally accepted in its respective country to Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) prescribed under Section 133 of the Act and other accounting principles generally accepted in India. We have reviewed these adjustments made by the Parent Company's Management. Our conclusions in so far as it related to such subsidiaries located outside India is based on the aforesaid conversion adjustments prepared by the Parent Company's Management and reviewed by us.

Our conclusion on the statement is not modified in respect of the above matter.
