Iga in cruise mode in women's singles Bopanna, Pavlasek move up in French Open doubles

Portugal's Borges upsets 7th seed Rudd

Paris, May 29: India's Rohan Bopanna and Czech partner Adam Pavlasek edged past the American pair of Robert Cash and James Tracy in a gripping first-round men's doubles encounter on Court 5 here on Wednesday.

The Indo-Czech duo prevailed 7-6, 5-7, 6-1 in a match that saw momentum swing back and forth before Bopanna and Pavlasek stamped their authority in the deciding set to seal victory in just under two hours.

The contest began on even footing with both teams holding serve throughout the opening set. Bopanna and Pavlasek held their nerve in the tiebreak, clinching it 8-6 to go one set up. However, the American team of Cash and Tracy came roaring back, breaking serve at a crucial juncture in the second set to take it 7-5.

With the match poised at one set all, Bopanna and Pavlasek lifted their game, racing to a five-game lead in the third. Despite a spirited effort from the Americans, the Indo-Czech pair closed out the deciding 6-1, 6-2 demolition of Britain's Emma Raducanu on Wednesday, extending her unbeaten streak at the French Open to 23 matches and making a resounding statement after a turbulent year on and off the court.

In a major upset on the clay courts of Roland Garros, Portuguese tennis player Nuno Borges stunned seventh seed Casper Ruud to secure a spot in the third round of the French Open. Borges, ranked World No. 42, overcame a shaky start to defeat Ruud 2-6, 6-4, 6-1, 6-0 in a match that lasted nearly three hours.

The World No. 5 Swiatek, playing under her lowest Grand Slam seeding since 2022, showed no signs of rust on Court Philippe-Chatrier as she delivered a performance worthy of her title as the "Queen of Clay." The dominant win comes on the back of a challenging year that included a one-month suspension for a doping violation and the personal loss of her grandfather ahead of the Madrid Masters.

Despite not having reached a final since last year's triumph in Paris, Swiatek appeared firmly in control from the outset, brushing aside the British No.2 in just 79 minutes to book her place in the third round for the seventh consecutive year.

Raducanu, currently ranked 41 in the world and making only her second French Open appearance since debuting in 2022, showed flashes of aggression early on but failed to capitalise on four break point chances. She has now lost all five meetings against Swiatek without claiming a set.

Swiatek struck 31 winners to Raducanu's eight and converted four breaks of serve while saving all break points against her. The gap in class and consistency was evident throughout, with the Polish star sealing the first set in 35 minutes with an ace and continuing to dominate the second with powerful groundstrokes and relentless pressure. Raducanu, who missed last year's edition due to injury, now exits in the second round again, continuing her search for stability on clay. Ruud began strongly, dominating the first set with powerful baseline play and precise shot-

making. However, Borges gradually found his rhythm, using his deft touch and consistent groundstrokes to turn the tide. After clinching the second set 6-4, Borges delivered an emphatic performance in the final two sets, breaking Ruud's serve multiple times and sealing the victory with an impressive 6-1, 6-0 scoreline.

The Norwegian, who came into the tournament as one of the favourites to contend for the title, appeared to be battling an injury during the latter stages of the match. Observers noted Ruud's reduced movement and visible discomfort, particularly on his left leg, which seemed to affect his ability to chase down balls and maintain his usual aggressive style. Medical staff were seen attending to him on court during changeovers, raising concerns about the severity of the injury.

Borges' composure under pressure and tactical adjustments, including more varied shot selection and improved net play, unsettled the higher-ranked opponent. The Portuguese player expressed his delight after the match, acknowledging the challenge of facing a top-ten player and praising his own resilience in overcoming the early setback. Ruud's exit represents a significant blow to the tournament's dynamics, opening up the draw for other contenders. The seventh seed had been expected to progress deep into the tournament, particularly on his favoured clay surface, where he has consistently performed well in past years. With this win, Borges advances to the third round, where he will face Australian Alexei Popyrin. The upcoming match promises to be another exciting encounter as Borges seeks to continue his breakthrough run in Paris.

Josh, David return boost for RCB ahead of IPL Q1

Chandigarh, May 29:

Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) have received a timely boost ahead of the IPL 2025 Qualifier 1 clash against Punjab Kings here on Friday, with the return of their crucial overseas stars Josh Hazlewood and Tim David, a development that could prove decisive in the high-stakes encounter at the Maharaja Yadavindra Singh Cricket Stadium, Mullanpur.

The playoffs always bring a different intensity, and RCB's strengthening bowling attack and finishing power with Hazlewood and David back in the fray significantly ups their

chances of toppling a strong Punjab Kings side, who have been one of the most consistent teams throughout the season.

Hazlewood, the leading wicket-taker for RCB this season with 18 wickets from 10 matches, brings experience, discipline, and control to the pace attack. His ability to contain runs and pick crucial wickets in the middle overs will be vital in curbing Punjab's deep batting lineup. Alongside Hazlewood, seasoned campaigner Bhuvneshwar Kumar and the all-round prowess of Krunal Pandya add further depth and variety to the attack.

Tim David's return is equally important. Known

for his power-hitting in the death overs, David provides the finishing touch RCB have often lacked. His ability to clear the boundaries quickly can shift momentum dramatically, especially in crunch playoff situations.

Royal Challengers Bengaluru's batting is anchored by the imperious Virat Kohli, who has been in scintillating form throughout the tournament. The veteran batsman has amassed over 600 runs at an average of 60.20, striking consistently to keep RCB in commanding positions. His eight fifties, including one in the last game, highlight his dominance.

Supporting Kohli is

Jitesh Sharma, whose blistering unbeaten 85 off just 33 balls in the last game exemplifies his match-winning potential. Phil Salt provides brisk starts at the top, while Rajat Patidar, despite recent fitness niggles, has contributed crucial runs at a strike rate above 140. Mayank Agarwal and Romario Shepherd have also stepped up, bringing valuable depth and flexibility.

Punjab Kings, however, cannot be underestimated. The team finished top of the league standings with nine wins from 14 matches, their best campaign since 2014. Their batting is balanced and resilient, featuring a potent opening pair in Prabhsimran Singh and Priyansh Arya, who have laid solid foundations time and again.

Captain Shreyas Iyer has been the calm anchor in the middle order, scoring over 500 runs at an impressive strike rate of 172. The contributions from Marcus Stoinis, Josh Inglis, and Shashank Singh in the late overs have often turned tight matches in Punjab's favour.

Punjab's bowling has been effective, led by Arshdeep Singh, who tops their wicket charts with 18 scalps. However, the absence of pace spearhead Marco Jansen due to international commitments poses a challenge. Kyle Jamieson is expected to shoulder additional responsibility, although his economy rate

has been a concern. The possible return of spinner Yuzvendra Chahal would be a welcome boost for the Kings, bringing much-needed experience and wicket-taking ability in the middle overs.

The pitch at Mullanpur is expected to favour batting, with an average first-innings score hovering around 170. Conditions suit stroke-makers, but early movement could assist seamers, especially in the powerplay. Toss-winning captains have preferred to bat first here, with three out of four matches this season won by the team batting upfront.

Weather forecasts predict a dry, hot evening with no rain interruptions, setting the stage for a full-length, high-octane battle.

While both teams are finely balanced, the return of Hazlewood and Tim David could tilt the scales marginally in favour of Royal Challengers Bengaluru, adding crucial firepower in both bowling and finishing departments. This, combined with Kohli's brilliance and a versatile bowling lineup, makes RCB slight favourites to clinch a direct berth in the final.

For Punjab Kings, maintaining their strong batting rhythm and exploiting home conditions will be key. The battle promises to be a thriller as both sides vie for a coveted spot in the IPL 2025 final.



Punish Our Engineers..!

Every time I hit a pothole; I feel I've just had a close encounter with a badly behaved asteroid. It jumps at my car without warning, crashes into my suspension system, and leaves me muttering words unfit for Sunday sermons. And while my poor vehicle groans from its underbelly, somewhere a government or municipal engineer sits sipping tea.

Last year, while holidaying in England, Scotland, and Ireland, we drove thousands of miles, through rain, mist, fog, and even sunshine—yes, they occasionally have that too. We journeyed across hills and dales, towns and villages, and not once—let me repeat—not once, did I see a flooded road or a pothole plotting revenge. And it's not as if the rain in Britain is genteel and poetic. No sir, it pours. It pummels. It lashes. But the roads? Smooth as a politician's promise before elections.

Why? It's not because the British have stumbled upon some magical tar that we haven't discovered. But the difference,

my dear reader, is supervision. That's the word. Supervision, like a strict Indian mother-in-law keeping an eye on her new daughter-in-law. Their engineers there watch like hawks. They measure the slope, study the drainage, and make sure water doesn't get a chance to settle and meditate in the middle of the road.

Every single British road I drove on was like a shallow tent—sloped ever so gently from the middle downwards. The rain obediently rolled off the surface and into neatly designed side drains, without once considering setting up residence on the road.

Here, in our beloved land, we build roads that are less inclined to drain water and more inclined to hoard it. We make water-beds, not roads. The moment it rains, the street outside my building becomes Lake Monsoon. Ducks could take swimming lessons, and cars transform into amphibians.

And yet—yet!—our engineers draw their salaries. Some retire with handsome pensions and are respectfully addressed as "Sir."

I say, let's make them answerable.

If a newly constructed road floods or potholes emerge before a monsoon has even properly flexed its muscles, freeze the engineer's salary. If he's retired, pause the pension. Let him face the potholes on foot. Only then will we get roads we can actually drive on, not navigate like an obstacle course in a reality show.

Also, let's send these gentlemen to live in our own army cantonments for a week. Let them study those roads—made with less drama, less money, but more pride. If you've driven through Navy Nagar in Mumbai, you'll know what I mean. Even a cyclone wouldn't shake those roads.

These engineers don't need more seminars. They need consequences.

Until then, fellow citizens, drive slow, steer around the craters, and remember—every pothole is not just a dent in the road, it's a monument to our silence, and a medal pinned on the chest of those who failed us..!
